The Draughtsman Alehouse 01



On platform 3b. A Victorian Buffet bar, empty for 18 years but now fully restored. Admire the Victorian wall tiles, and mounted draughtsman's drawings

The Plough 02



This two room historic pub is a quiet oasis of calm. The interior, from 1934, is listed on CAMRA's National Inventory of Historic Pub Interiors

The Tut 'n' Shive 03



The pub used to be called the 'Spread Eagle' and there is still a large stone eagle outside. A rock jukebox and sport feature

The Red Lion 04



This Wetherspoons pub has a long history. Here in 1778 the St Leger was named and a brass plate of all winners commemorates this

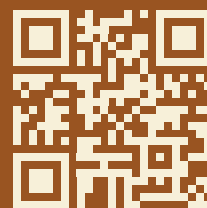
GETTING HERE

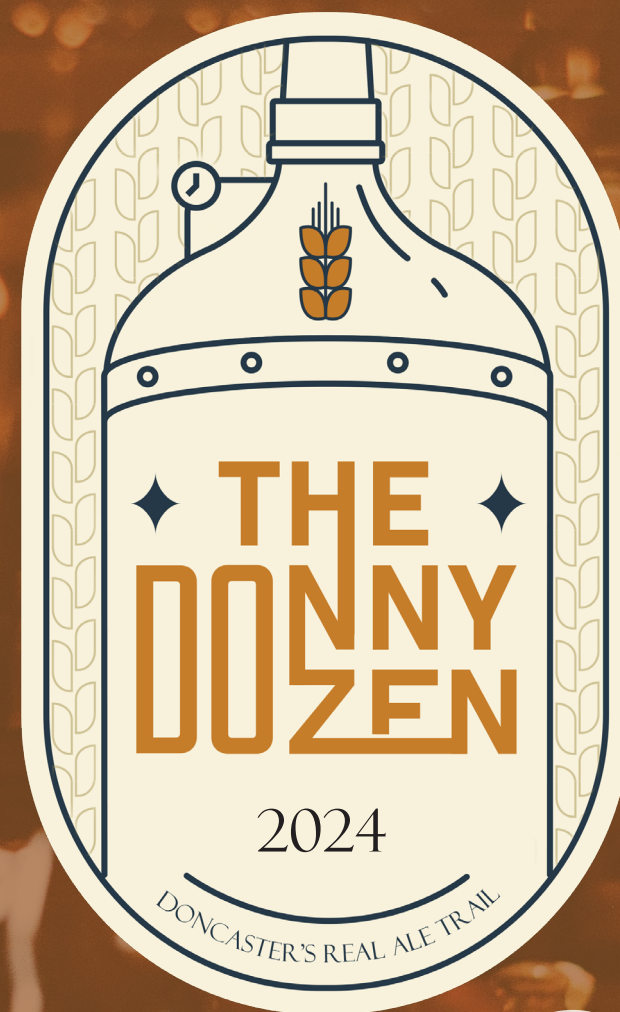

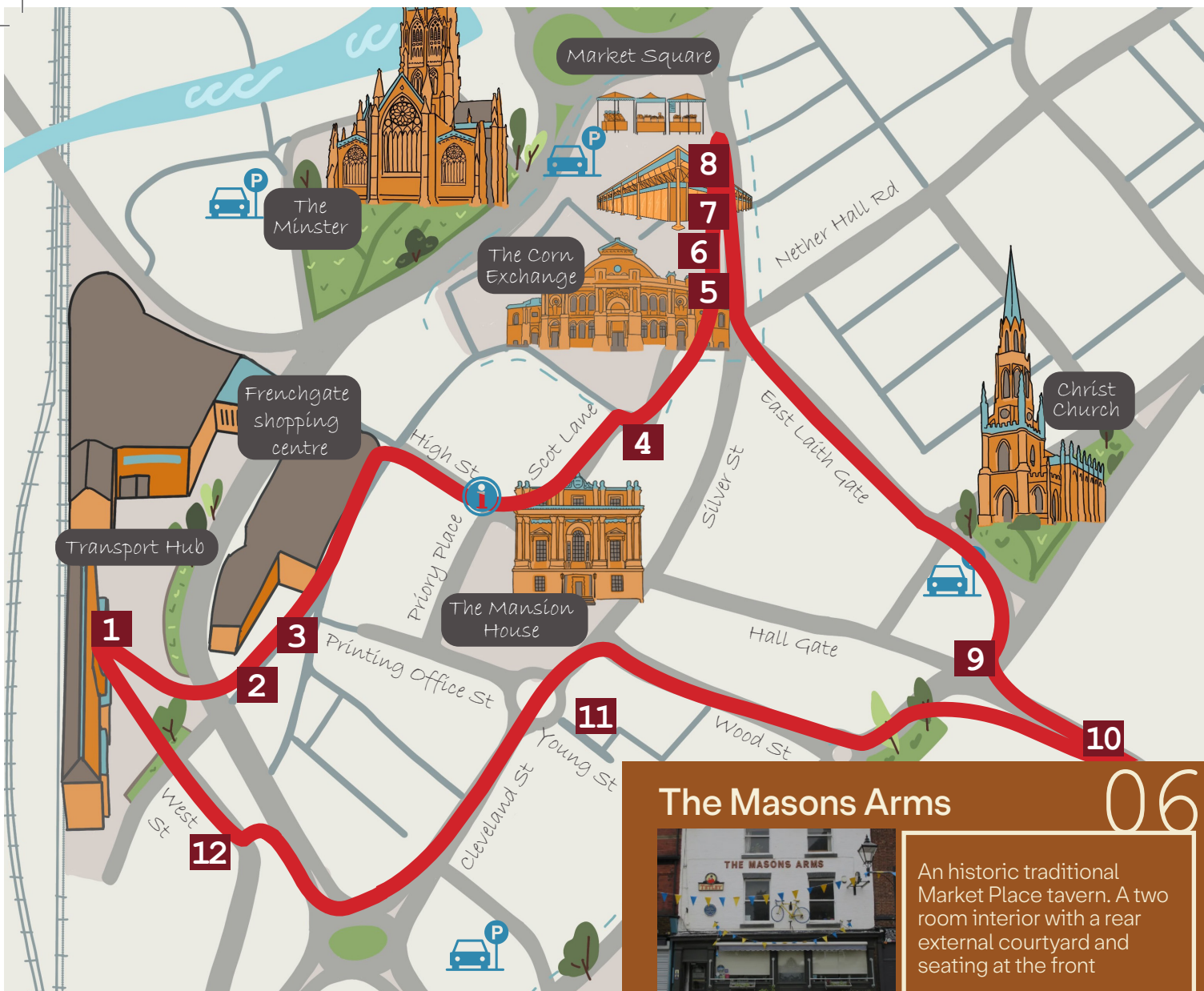

Don Valley Brewery Tap 08



Don Valley Brewery operate a concession stand within the Wool Market complex. Communal seating is available inside or outside by the market square

Hallcross 09



Former home of Stocks Brewery the beers are now back including 'Old Horizontal'. Refurbished interior, rear courtyard and sun drenched seats at the front

The Salutation 10



An historic former coaching inn with a single room bar and large decked outside area. Doncaster Rovers FC began life here

The Masons Arms 06



An historic traditional Market Place tavern. A two room interior with a rear external courtyard and seating at the front

Doncaster Brewery Tap 11



Home of Doncaster Brewery serving their range of beers. The brewery is situated in the building

The Queen 05



An old established market place corner pub featuring a recently refurbished, music based, shabby chic interior. Live music at weekends

Market Place Ale House 07



Converted in 2013 and now a fully functioning micro pub. It features a quirky interior and sunny seating area outside overlooking the market

The Leopard 12



A prominent corner pub. Two downstairs rooms and an upstairs room hosts live music and boasts some famous past visitors
