With its history stretching right back to Roman times Doncaster has long been a mecca for the thirsty traveller. To showcase this our City Centre Hospitality Forum and CAMRA have joined together to compile the Donny Dozen Real Ale Trail, a route guiding the visitor through important stages in Doncaster's history whilst enjoying the delights of the best and most historic hostelries.

The Draughtsman Alehouse (



On platform 3b. A Victorian Buffet bar, empty for 18 years but now fully restored. Admire the Victorian wall tiles, and mounted draughtsman's drawings.

The Plough



This two room historic pub is a quiet oasis of calm. The interior, from 1934, is listed on CAMRA's National Inventory of Historic Pub Interiors.

The Tut & Shive




The pub used to be called the 'Spread Eagle' and there is still a large stone eagle outside. A rock jukebox and sport feature.

The Red Lion



This Wetherspoons pub has a long history. Here in 1778 the St Leger was named and a brass plate of all winners commemorates this.



The Salutation



An historic former coaching inn with a single room bar and large decked outside area. Doncaster Rovers FC began life here.

Doncaster Brewery Tap



Home of Doncaster Brewery serving their range of beers. Set in a converted shop with the brewery behind and outdoor seating.

The Leopard



A prominent corner pub. Two downstairs rooms and an upstairs room hosts live music and boasts some famous past visitors.
