

The Draughtsman Alehouse





The Plough



This two room historic pub is a quiet oasis of calm. The interior, from 1934, is listed on CAMRA's National Inventory of Historic Pub Interiors

Don Valley Brewery Tap



Don Valley Brewery operate a concession stand within the Wool Market complex. Communal seating is available inside or outside by the market square

Hallcross



Formerly Stocks Brewery, the beers are now back including 'Old Horizontal'. Refurbished interior, rear courtyard and sun drenched seats at the front

The Tut 'n' Shive



The pub used to be called the 'Spread Eagle' and there is still a large stone eagle outside. A rock jukebox and sport feature

The Red Lion



This Wetherspoons pub has a long history. Here in 1778 the St Leger was named and a brass plate of all winners commemorates this

The Salutation



An historic former coaching inn with a single room bar and large decked outside area. Doncaster Rovers FC began life here

The Gate House



The Gate House is a purpose-built, large, open plan, award winning, Wetherspoons pub

The Queen



An old established market place corner pub featuring a recently refurbished, music based, shabby chic interior. Live music at weekends

The Masons Arms



An historic traditional Market Place tavern. A two room interior with a rear external courtyard and seating at the front

Doncaster Brewery Tap



Home of Doncaster Brewery serving their range of beers. The brewery is situated in the building

The Leopard



A prominent corner pub. Two downstairs rooms and an upstairs room hosts live music and boasts some famous past visitors
